Over the next five week's I will be exploring the five pillars of well-being, **Connecting, Giving, Taking Notice, Learning and Being Active.**



We have all had such a wonderful *Sports Enrichment Week* in school; it has been a great reminder that enjoying exercise is so important for our well-being. Joining in with purposeful activities and being active is not only extremely good for us it is also great fun.

Taking part in sport and being active as part of a team or on our own can be a fun and interactive way of getting exercise that does not have to feel like exercising! Making exercise fun rather than something, you have to do can be a motivator to keep it up.

Being active can make you feel happier and improve mood. It produces changes in the parts of the brain that regulate stress and anxiety. It can also increase brain sensitivity for the hormones serotonin and norepinephrine. Additionally, exercise can increase the production of endorphins, which are known to help produce positive feelings and reduce the perception of pain.

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Interestingly, it does not matter how intense your activity is. It seems that your mood can benefit from exercise no matter the intensity of the physical activity.
