

Supporting Back to School Routines

Times of change and the return to school can be a challenge. Reducing difficulties going back to school by even a small amount can make a big difference to many parents and children. Changes can feel difficult but it can provide opportunities for children to develop their understanding and resilience. If your child is particularly unsure of transitions and going back to school, here are a few ideas to help support back to school routines:

- Ensure healthy routines, including a regular bedtime and healthy diet.
- Talk about what they will be doing and explore rules and expectations
- Listen to your child, empathise and normalise feelings or fears
- Role Play and Problem Solve, try not to say "don't worry" or "you will be fine" get your child to problem solve for themselves and discuss appropriate responses.
- Model confidence, be cheerful and positive about the return to school.
- Be mindful of separation at the school gates, which can be very challenging and upsetting for some children and for parents with big emotions for everyone involved. If your child is upset, leave them with a staff member who will be ready to support them through their anxiety once you are gone.
- Resist the urge to hover outside.
- If you are concerned, please call the school office a short time later to ask if your child has settled.
