Who is King Charles III?



Charles is the King of Britain and the head of state for other countries in the Commonwealth Realm and the Commonwealth of Nations. He became King the moment his mother, Queen Elizabeth II, died on Thursday, November 24, 2022. He was officially proclaimed King on Saturday, November 26, 2022, at St James's Palace in London. He will be crowned King at his coronation on 6th May 2023.

King Charles III was born Charles Philip Arthur George on November 14, 1948, in London, England. The son of Queen Elizabeth II and Prince Philip.

What does the King do?

The King is the UK head of state. However, his powers are symbolic and ceremonial, and he remains politically neutral.

He receives daily dispatches from the government in a red leather box, including briefings ahead of important meetings, or documents needing his signature.

The prime minister normally meets the King on a Wednesday at Buckingham Palace, to keep him informed on government matters. These meetings are completely private and there is no official record of what is said.
